

CHAPTER 71: TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

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GENERAL PROVISIONS

§71.001 SCHOOL BUSES.

(A) The driver of a vehicle shall not overtake or meet and pass any school bus which has stopped for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers.

(B) The driver of a vehicle overtaking or meeting any school bus which has stopped and is displaying two alternately flashing red lights located at the same level shall bring such vehicle to a full stop at least ten feet from the school bus and shall not proceed until the school bus driver resumes motion or the school bus driver signals to proceed or the visual signals are no longer actuated. Passengers crossing a road upon being discharged from a school bus shall cross in front of the stopped school bus. Signs giving notice of such local traffic regulation shall be posted upon or at the entrance to the area or part of affected as may be most appropriate or sufficiently legible as to be seen by an ordinarily observant person.

MOTOR VEHICLE CODE

§ 71.015 APPLICABILITY.

The provisions of this subchapter shall apply to all properties, lands and premises within the city limits. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98)

§ 71.016 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this subchapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

DRIVER. Every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

LICENSE. Any license, temporary instruction permit or temporary license issued under the laws of this state pertaining to the licensing of persons to operate motor vehicles.

MOTOR VEHICLE. Every vehicle which is self-propelled.

OPERATOR. Every person, other than a chauffeur, who is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle.

OWNER.

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(1) Any person, firm, association or corporation renting a motor vehicle or having the exclusive use thereof, under a lease or otherwise, for a period greater than 24 hours; or

(2) A person who holds legal title of a vehicle, or in the event a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or lease, with the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement, and with an immediate right of possession in the conditional lease or vendee, or in the event a creditor of a vehicle is entitled to possession, then such conditional lessee or vendee or creditor shall be deemed the owner.

PARKING. Standing a vehicle, whether occupied or not, upon any property which this subchapter applies to.

PEDESTRIAN. Any person on foot.

POLICE OFFICER. Every Sheriff or his or her deputies, any officer of the Michigan State Police, and the Lake City Enforcement Officer.

SIDEWALK. That portion of a street between the curb lines or the lateral lines of the roadway and the adjacent property lines and any other paved surface or pathway intended for pedestrian use.

TRAFFIC. Pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles and other conveyances either singly or together while using any property which this subchapter applies to for the purpose of travel.

TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE. Any device, sign or other instrument by which traffic is directed to stop or proceed, or is otherwise controlled.

VEHICLE. Every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported, except devices moved solely by human power. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98)

§ 71.017 ESTABLISHMENT OF TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.

The City Council may place and maintain at their discretion such traffic control devices not inconsistent with the provisions of this subchapter as it shall deem necessary to indicate and carry out the provisions of this subchapter or to regulate, warn or guide traffic. All such traffic control devices hereafter erected shall conform to state specifications for such devices. No such signs shall be erected unless approved by the Traffic Engineer for the city. Costs of erection and maintenance of such signs shall be paid by the city. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98)

§ 71.018 INTERFERENCE WITH TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.

No person shall without lawful authority attempt to, or in fact alter, deface, injure, knock down or

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remove any traffic control device or any part thereof. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§71.019 OBEDIENCE TO TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.

No driver of a vehicle shall disobey instructions of any traffic control sign, stop sign or other sign or device erected for the control of traffic unless otherwise directed by a police officer. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.020 OBEDIENCE TO POLICE OFFICERS.

No person shall refuse to comply with any order of a police officer when such officer is guiding, directing or regulating traffic on any property to which this subchapter applies. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.021 SPEED RESTRICTION; ASSURED CLEAR DISTANCE AHEAD.

Any person driving a vehicle upon property to which this subchapter applies shall drive the vehicle at a careful and prudent speed not greater than nor less than is reasonable with regard to the traffic, surface and width of the roadway and other conditions then existing, and no person shall drive any vehicle upon a roadway at a speed greater than will permit the driver to stop the vehicle within the assured clear distance ahead. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.022 SPEED LIMITS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of any posted speed limit. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§71.023 CARELESS DRIVING.

Any person who drives any vehicle upon property to which this subchapter applies in a careless or negligent manner likely to endanger any person or property, but without being wanton or reckless, shall be guilty of careless driving. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.024 EQUIPMENT.

No person shall drive, move or knowingly allow the driving or moving of any vehicle, or

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combination of vehicles which is in such unsafe condition as to endanger any person or which does not contain parts, or is not at all times equipped with such lamps, and other equipment, all in proper condition and adjustments, as required by the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code. Any police officer, as defined herein, is authorized to stop and inspect any motor vehicle on any reasonable grounds which would indicate a violation of this section and, if any defects are found, to issue a civil infraction citation for the violation. § 71.025 PERMISSIVE VEHICLES.

A motor vehicle not licensed as such by the state, or by any state with which Michigan has reciprocal licensing provisions for travel on the public highways of the state, may not be operated within the city without the express written permission of the City Council or the City Enforcement Officer. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.026 UNNECESSARY NOISE.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle with unnecessary noise, or start, move or turn a motor vehicle, or apply the brakes or the power on a motor vehicle, or in any manner operate it to cause the tires to squeal, or to cause the tires or vehicle to make any noise not usually associated with the normal operation of the motor vehicle, except in case of emergency. (Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§71.027 EXCESSIVE NOISE BY A MOTOR VEHICLE.

(A) No person shall operate a motor vehicle on a street or a frozen lake, nor shall any person race or accelerate the motor of a vehicle while running idly unless such motor is equipped with a muffler and an exhaust system in good working order and in constant operation to prevent excessive and unnecessary noise. No muffler or any part of the exhaust system of a motor vehicle shall be replaced, changed or altered in any manner so as to increase the noise, smoke or noxious gases emitting from the exhaust system.

(B) No person shall operate any motor vehicle in such a manner or one that is so changed, altered or out of repair, or so loaded as to create loud and unnecessary grating, rattling, squealing of tires, explosions or any other excessive and unnecessary noise.

(C) Anyone violating the provisions of this section shall upon conviction by a court of law be subject to the penalty set forth § 71.999.

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SNOWMOBILES

§ 71.040 OPERATION OF SNOWMOBILES WITHIN CITY LIMITS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile within the city except upon property owned by the operator or upon the property of another who has given permission for such operation. Snowmobiles shall be permitted to travel any city street or alley for the, express purpose of entering or leaving the city, providing they use the shortest possible route for this travel except no snowmobile shall travel on M-66 or M-55 within the city limits, except in crossing with due caution. All snowmobiles must travel as far as possible to the right side of the street or alley. ('69 Code, § 3105.1) (Am. Ord. A-6, passed 12-21-70) Penalty, see § 71.999

§71.041 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this subchapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

OPERATE. To ride in or on and to control the operation of a snowmobile.

OPERATOR. Any person who operates or is in actual control of the snowmobile.

SNOWMOBILES. Any motorized vehicle designed for travel primarily on snow or ice steered by wheels, skis, or runners. ('69 Code, §3105.2)

§ 71.042 EMERGENCY TRAVEL.

Snowmobiles may be operated on sidewalks and highways during a period of emergency when so declared by the police agency having jurisdiction, when travel by conventional automotive equipment is not possible. ('69 Code, §3105.3)

§71.043 SPECIAL EVENTS.

Snowmobiles may be operated in the city for special snowmobile events of limited duration which are conducted according to a prearranged schedule under permit for the city, or in areas so designated by the City Council for the operation of snowmobiles. ('69 Code, §3105.4)

§ 71.044 SNOWMOBILE REGULATIONS.

Even when given a permit for special events, no person shall operate a snowmobile:

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(A) At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper and having due regard for the conditions then existing.

(B) While under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotic drugs, barbitol or any derivative of barbitol.

(C) During the hours of from *Vi* hour before sunset to *Vi* hour after sunrise without displaying a headlight which is lighted and a lighted taillight.

(D) Unless it is equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke. f 69 Code, § 3105.5) Penalty, see § 71.99

§ 71.045 SNOWMOBILE SPEED LIMITS.

No snowmobile shall be operated at a rate of speed greater than ten miles per hour and shall observe all other traffic regulations in effect within the city limits. ('69 Code, § 3105.6) Penalty, see § 71.999

PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS

§ 71.060 APPLICABILITY.

The provisions of this subchapter shall apply to all properties, lands and premises of the Lake City Public School District located in the city. ('69 Code, § 3107.1) (Am. Ord. A-19, passed 10-10-77)

§71.061 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this subchapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

DRIVER. Every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

LICENSE Any license, temporary instruction permit or temporary license issued under the laws of this state pertaining to the licensing of persons to operate motor vehicles.

MOTOR VEHICLE. Every vehicle which is self-propelled.

OPERATOR. Every person, other than a chauffeur, who is in actual physical control of a motor

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vehicle.

OWNER.

(1) Any person, firm, association or corporation renting a motor vehicle or having the exclusive use thereof, under a lease or otherwise, for a period of greater than 24 hours.

(2) A person who holds legal title of a vehicle or in the event a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or lease thereof, with the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession in the conditional lease or vendee or in the event a mortgagor or a vehicle is entitled to possession, then such conditional lessee or vendee or mortgagor shall be deemed the owner.

PARKING. Standing a vehicle, whether occupied or not, upon any property which this subchapter applies to, not loading or unloading.

PEDESTRIAN. Any person afoot.

POLICE OFFICER. Every sheriff or his or her deputies, city officer and officer of the Michigan State Police.

SIDEWALK. That portion of a street between the curb line, or the lateral lines of the roadway and adjacent property lines and any other paved surface or pathway intended for the use of pedestrians.

TRAFFIC. Pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles and other conveyances, either singly or together while using any property which this subchapter applies to for purpose of travel.

TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE. Any device sign or other instrument by which traffic is directed to stop or proceed or is otherwise controlled.

VEHICLE. Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported, excepting devices moved by human power. ('69 Code, §3107.2)

§ 71.062 ESTABLISHMENT OF TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.

The Board of Education of the Lake City School District may place and maintain upon district property such traffic control devices not inconsistent with the provisions of this subchapter as it shall deem necessary to indicate and carry out the provisions of this subchapter or to regulate, warn or guide traffic. All such traffic control devices hereafter erected shall conform to State of Michigan specifications. No such signs shall be erected unless approved by the Traffic Engineer for the city. Costs of erection and maintenance of such signs shall be

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paid by the school. ('69 Code, §3107.3)

§ 71.063 INTERFERENCE WITH TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.

No person shall without lawful authority attempt to or in fact alter, deface, injure, knock down or remove any traffic control device or any part thereof. ('69 Code, § 3107.4) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.064 OBEDIENCE TO TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES.

No driver of a vehicle shall disobey instructions of any traffic control sign, stop sign or other sign or device erected for the control of traffic unless at the time otherwise directed by a police officer. ('69 Code, § 3107.5) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.065 OBEDIENCE TO POLICE OFFICERS.

No person shall refuse to comply with any order of a police officer when such officer is guiding, directing or regulating traffic on any property for which this subchapter applies. ('69 Code, § 3107.6) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.066 SPEED RESTRICTION.

Any person driving a vehicle upon Lake City School District property shall drive the same at a careful and prudent speed not greater than nor less than is reasonable and proper having due regard to the traffic, surface and width of the roadway and of other conditions then existing, and no person shall drive any vehicle upon a roadway at a speed greater than will permit him or her to bring it to a stop within the assured, clear distance ahead. ('69 Code, § 3107.7) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.067 SPEED LIMITS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour on school district property. ('69 Code, § 3107.8) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.068 DRIVING UNDER INFLUENCE.

A person, whether licensed or not, who is an habitual user of narcotic drugs, barbitol, a derivative of barbitol or marijuana, shall not drive a vehicle on a street or highway, or any other place open to the general public, including any area designated for the parking of motor vehicles. ('69 Code, § 3107.9) Penalty, see § 71.999

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§71.069 RECKLESS AND CARELESS DRIVING.

Any person who drives any vehicle upon property for which this subchapter applies, carelessly and heedlessly in willful or wanton disregard of the rights or safety of others or without due caution or circumspection and at a speed or in a manner so as to endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property shall be guilty *ci* reckless driving. Any person who drives any vehicle upon property for which

this subchapter applies, in a careless or negligent manner likely to endanger any person or property, but without wantonness or recklessness shall be deemed to be guilty of careless driving. The offense of careless driving shall be deemed to be an included offense under the charge of reckless driving. ('69 Code, § 3107.10) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.070 EQUIPMENT.

(A) It is a misdemeanor for any person to drive or move or for the owner to cause or knowingly permit to be driven or moved on properties for which this subchapter applies, any vehicle or combination of vehicles which is in such unsafe condition as to endanger any person or which does not contain those parts or is not at all times equipped with such lamps and other equipment all in proper condition and adjustment as required by the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code.

(B) Any police officer may be authorized on any reasonable grounds shown to stop any motor vehicle and inspect the same, and if any defects are found to arrest the driver in the manner provided by law.

§71.071 PERMISSIVE VEHICLES.

A motor vehicle not licensed as such by the Michigan Department of State or any state with which Michigan has reciprocal licensing provisions for travel on the public highways of the state may not be operated on properties belonging to the Lake City School District without the express written permission of the school district. ('69 Code, § 3107.12) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.072 LICENSE REQUIRED.

Motor vehicles may be operated for which this subchapter is applicable only by persons possessing a valid operators license or permit from the Michigan Department of State or states with which the state has reciprocal license provisions. ('69 Code, § 3107.13) Penalty, see § 71.999

§71.073 OPERATION CONFINED.

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Motor vehicles other than school district vehicles shall not be operated except upon roadways, driveways, or parking lots designed for vehicular traffic unless express written approval for operation elsewhere is obtained from the school district. ('69 Code, § 3107.14) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.074 UNNECESSARY NOISE.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle with unnecessary noise or start, move or turn a motor vehicle, or apply the brakes or the power on a motor vehicle, or in any manner operate it so as to cause the tires to squeal or the tires or vehicle to make any noise not usually connected with the operation of the motor vehicle except in case of an emergency. ('69 Code, § 3107.16) Penalty, see § 71.999

TRUCKS

§ 71.090 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this subchapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

TRUCK. A truck, truck trailer, trailer, or semi-trailer, as defined in Public Act 300 of 1949, being M.C.L.A. §§ 257.1 through 257.923, or any combination thereof. ('69 Code, § 3109.1) (Am. Ord. passed 7-13-82)

§71.091 TRUCK SIZE.

The operation of any truck larger than a van, panel or pickup truck is prohibited upon every street in the city except on state highways M-55 and M-66. ('69 Code, § 3109.2) (Am. Ord. passed 7-13-92) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 71.092 EXCEPTIONS.

No provision of this subchapter shall prohibit:

(A) The operation of emergency vehicles upon streets in the city;

(B) The operations of trucks owned or operated by the city, any contractor or material man while engaged in the repair, maintenance or construction of streets, street improvements or street utilities within the city.

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(C) The operation of a truck upon any established detour in any case where such trucks could lawfully be operated upon the street for which such detour is established.

(D) Any truck which is taking departure from or proceeding to a destination on a prohibited street from operating on such prohibited streets as may be reasonably necessary in traveling to or from, as the case may be, the nearest street intersection on a street wherein such truck is permitted to operate.

(E) Any truck while engaged in one or more local pick-ups or deliveries from using such prohibited streets as may be reasonably necessary in so doing, provided that such truck shall upon completion of the last pickup or delivery, return by the shortest route to the nearest street upon which it is permitted to operate.

§ 71.999 PENALTY.

(A) Any person violating any provision of this section for which no other penalty is set forth shall be subject to the penalty provisions of § 70.99.

(B) Any person, firm or corporation which violates, disobeys, neglects or refuses to comply with any provision of §§ 71.015 through 71.027 shall be guilty of a civil infraction, and upon being found responsible for a violation shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$500, together with prosecution costs and court costs, in the discretion of the court. (Ord. A-61, passed 1-12-98; Am. Ord. A-62, passed 1-7-98; Am. Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98)

(C) Any person violating §§ 71.040 through 71.045 and § 72.02 shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$100 or imprisoned in the Missaukee County Jail for a period of not more than 90 days or shall have both fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court hearing the case. 069 Code, § 3105.8)

(D) Any person, firm, corporation, partnership, association or society that violates §§ 71.060 through 71.074 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$500 dollars and/or confinement in the county jail for a period not exceeding 90 days or both. Each act committed in violation of the provisions hereof shall be deemed a public offense and shall be punishable accordingly. 069 Code, § 3107.18)

(E) Anyone violating the provisions of §§ 71.091 through 71.092 shall, upon conviction by a court of law, be subject to a fine of not more than \$50. 069 Code, § 3109.4) (Am. Ord. passed 7-13-92)

§ 72.01 SNOW REMOVAL PARKING INSTRUCTIONS.

(A) From November 1 to May 1 of any year, no person shall park or leave standing any vehicle on any street or alley in the corporate limits of the city between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

(B) No person shall move or cause to be moved any snow or other material into any street or alley within the corporate limits of the city.

§ 72.02 PROHIBITED PARKING.

No person shall park a vehicle in any of the following places:

- (A) On a sidewalk;
- (B) In front of any driveway;
- (C) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant or the entrance to any instructional building;
- (D) Within an intersection;
- (E) On a designated cross-walk;
- (F) At any place at any time when official signs prohibit parking;
- (G) At any place where parking is permitted for specific purposes unless the occupants of the vehicle are complying with the requirements of said permitted uses;
- (H) On more than one designated parking space; and
- (I) On any grass or otherwise landscaped area. (‘69 Code, § 3107.15) (Ord. A-63, passed 1-7-98) Penalty, see § 71.999

§ 73.01 PROHIBITED ON CITY PROPERTY.

The use of skateboards, scooters and roller skates or rollerblades shall be prohibited on on all property owned or controlled by the City of Lake City, including but not limited to: all City owned parks, all sidewalks, all street and all parking areas. Skateboarding will be allowed only at Reeder Park, and only on the designated Skate board Area Front Street. ('69 Code, § 3108.1) (Am. Ord. A-43, passed 1-14-91, Am. § 73.02 RACING PROHIBITED.

The riding of bicycles is prohibited on all sidewalks commencing from Canal Street west to Front Street, and from Union Street, north to Mitchell Street. ('69 Code, § 3108.2) (Am. Ord. A-43, passed 1-14-91;Am. Ord. A-73.01-.02, passed 9-13-04) Penalty, see § 73.99

§73.03 WAIVER OF REGULATIONS.

The provisions set forth in this chapter shall be waived for special events, (for example, parades and similar activities), of limited duration which are conducted according to a prearranged schedule under permit for the city. ('69 Code, § 3108.3) (Am. Ord. A-43, passed 1-14-91) Penalty, see § 73.99

§ 73.04 ENFORCEMENT.

This chapter will be enforced by the ordinance enforcement official designated by the City Council. ('69 Code, § 3108.5) (Am. Ord. A-43, passed 1-14-91)

§ 73.99 PENALTY.

Any violation of this chapter will constitute a civil infraction punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100. ('69 Code, § 3108.4) (Am. Ord. A-43, passed 1-14-91)

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CHAPTER 74: TRAFFIC SCHEDULES

Section

SCHEDULE I. SPEED LIMITS.

(A) No person shall operate a motor vehicle upon the streets of the city at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard to the traffic and use of the streets at all times. No person shall operate or drive any motor vehicle upon Main Street in the city at greater speeds than are prescribed as follows:

<i>Street</i>	<i>Location</i>	<i>Speed Limit</i>
Main Street	From north city limits to Mitchell Street	35
Main Street	From Mitchell Street south to Union Street	25
Main Street	From Union Street to First Street in Langley's addition to city	35
Main Street	From First Street to the south city limits	35

(B) In no event will any person operate their motor vehicle at a speed greater than 25 miles per hour with the exception of the aforementioned designated areas. ('69 Code, § 3103.6) (Ord. A-4, passed 12-8-69) Penalty, see § 70.99

SCHEDULE II. STOP INTERSECTIONS.

Stop signs to regulate the movement and/or stopping and standing of all vehicles as defined in Section 1.044 and all pedestrians as defined in Section 1.022 shall be erected at the following intersections:
