WHEREAS, The City of Lake City has authorized, PER ORDINANCE, the appointment
of an Ordinance Enforcement Officer hereinafter known as OEO; and

WHEREAS, The City shall investigate the possibility of a shared officer between the
townships and the City of Lake City; and,

WHEREAS, following a time period suitable for orientation the OEO shall be authorized
to investigate ordinance violations, investigate complaints based on civil infraction
violations under the city and township codes and issue notice of violation and/or civil
infraction citations under the respective Code of Ordinance and appear in court where
said appearance will assist in the prosecution of ordinance violations; and

WHEREAS, the mayor and council shall with mutual agreement of participating
townships and of the OEO shall prescribe hours of patrol; and

WHEREAS, the OEO shall receive an shared annual salary to be paid in time intervals
specified by the appointee, and in accordance with applicable municipal labor and
finance laws; and

WHEREAS, all requirements for the adoption of said resolution having been fully
complied with;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lake City Council, at a Special
Meeting of the City Council, held in the Lake City Municipal Building on the 9th day of
May, 2022 at 7:00 PM that the City Council of Lake City shall work to hire an
Ordinance Enforcement Officer with all powers and authorities granted by Ordinance.

WHEREAS, the Michigan Strategic Fund has invited Units of General Local Government to apply for its Water-Related Infrastructure (WRI) Competitive Funding Round; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lake City desires to request \$500,000 in CDBG funds to design and construct a water main adjacent to M-66 from Mitchell Street to M-55 and also replace seven fire hydrants at various locations throughout the City.

WHEREAS, the City of Lake City commits local funds from its Water Fund in the amount of \$1250,000; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is consistent with the local Community Development Plan as described in the Application; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project will benefit all residents of the project area and 59.42 percent of the residents of the City of Lake City are low and moderate income persons as determined by an income survey approved by the Michigan Economic Development Corporation; and

WHEREAS, local funds and any other funds to be invested in the project have not been obligated/incurred and will not be obligated/incurred prior to a formal grant award, completion of the environmental review procedures and a formal written authorization to obligate/incure costs from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Lake City hereby designates the Mayor as the Environmental Review Certifying Officer, the person authorized to certify the Michigan CDBG Application, the person authorized to sign the Grant Agreement and payment requests, and the person authorized to execute any additional documents required to carry out and complete the grant.
