
- ✓ Continually work hard, as a team, and provide exceptional customer service for the citizens and visitors alike, in this great community.

#### Current Projects & Collective Achievements...

First, I am excited to report that we have made significant progress on our utility billing software and related hardware upgrades. It's difficult to quantify, but this has been a really big project for our team, and our staff continues to make progress. We are looking forward to the prospect of getting back to a 'normal' billing period real soon.

- As we move forward, we would like to discourage the practice (to the extent possible) of taking over/under payments for <u>utility</u> <u>bills</u>, and we recognize some have been doing this practice for a long time, though the perceived convenience factors will hopefully represent a dated idea once we offer auto bill pay, or by sending bills via email, etc.
  - o Longer term, we'd ask that you please consider that we can email a copy of your bill and/or you can setup auto bill pay because general management of the funds is a timely process for staff, and we recently confirmed that we have an inordinate number



of over/under payments going into our books which can/will have a deleterious impact.


- o If the transaction has been completed in the BS&A Utility Billing then any subsequent changes will necessitate manager approval prior to making a change, which is a good additional control or improvement without being too onerous for staff.
- As a reminder, we need your email address, because we will be able to send bills electronically, so here is the contact form if
  you have not provided your email address, please see <u>Contact City of Lake City</u>.
- ✓ Again, the city's Assessing, Utility, and Tax data will now safely reside in the metaphorical BS&A cloud.
  - o In terms of our related program data, the vendor has taken on the responsibility for security and related data backup and general management.
- ✓ We removed over 70 stumps this fall from various locations in the city via Joe's Tree Service--- a big thank you to Joe and his team, and further thank you to Ray and all LC staff that helped clean up the parks.
- ✓ We received council approval to proceed with a citywide roadway project to address several streets in the CLC, which will commence next year.

#### Affordable Housing....

You've possibly heard about an affordable housing shortage throughout the State of Michigan.... In this context, the City of Lake City has been conducting research pertaining to housing, looking at related grant opportunities and concurrently working with area partners to assess this emerging trend. In terms of recent efforts, the city's leadership team has participated in housing events, and further continually served on a housing board and attended related events. The cited research and related work will buttress subsequent efforts by council to implement a long-term strategy to support the community's housing needs. Since housing is increasingly becoming a concern across communities, the subsequent efforts or program successes will likely be predicated on a creative and/or team approach spanning across jurisdictions.



In a recent study from the Gerald R. Ford School of Public Policy at the University of Michigan, the statewide survey participants observed additional housing concerns in their most recent study. As you begin to assess relevant information, the cited study outlines some areas that were identified as being a concern in local communities, please see the ensuing link for the complete study.

Based on U of M's survey, they provided a synopsis on their website to outline a couple of their 'key' findings, including:

Statewide, 41% of Michigan local officials report a shortage of single-family housing options in their community, up sharply from 23% who said the same in 2017.





- A majority (52%) of local leaders from both the U.P. and the Northern Lower Peninsula say their communities currently lack sufficient affordable housing.
- Over half (51%) of local leaders from Michigan cities, villages and townships report housing stock that is out-of-date, and 53% say their housing stock suffers from blight. These assessments are essentially unchanged from 2017.



#### **History of Veterans Day**

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" – officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day



of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars." Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good. For those that would like to help, you should consider this opportunity, especially those that want to help though are possibly concerned about related scheduling and time constraints. The total time and frequency commitments are quite low compared to other positions. In short, you'll need to complete a web-based training every two years, and you will meet approximately 1-3 times a year as needed—that's it!
